

**BOROUGH OF FRACKVILLE  
REORGANIZATION MEETING  
JANUARY 6, 2014**

The Reorganization Meeting of Frackville Borough Council opened with the "Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag". Judge John E. Domalakes presided with the swearing in of Mayor Kim Phillips and Council members William P. Creasy, Karen L. Domalakes, Bradley Gotshall, John M. Morgan, Jr., and Peter Zuber.

Mayor Phillips called the meeting to order. All Council members were present except Berger. On nomination by Zuber, Ronald Jordan was appointed to the office of President by a vote of 6-0. President Jordan then presided over the rest of the Reorganization Meeting.

On nomination by Gotshall, Peter Zuber was appointed Vice President by a vote of 6-0.

On nomination by Zuber, Bradley Gotshall was appointed President Pro Tem by a vote of 6-0.

On nomination by Zuber, John Chuma was appointed as Chairman of the Vacancy Board by a vote of 6-0.

On motion by Gotshall, seconded by Creasy, Mark Semanchik, Esquire, was appointed as Solicitor by a vote of 6-0.

On motion by Morgan, seconded by Creasy, Entech Engineering, Inc., was appointed as engineer by a vote of 6-0.

On motion by Morgan, seconded by Gotshall, Brenda Deeter was appointed as Secretary/Treasurer by a vote of 6-0.

On motion by Domalakes, seconded by Morgan, Elaine Kupusnick was appointed as Assistant Secretary/Treasurer by a vote of 6-0.

On motion by Gotshall, seconded by Zuber, the regular monthly meeting date will be the second Wednesday of each month to begin at 7:00 p.m., was approved by a vote of 6-0.

On motion by Gotshall, seconded by Domalakes, to set the bond for the Secretary/Treasurer and the Assistant Secretary/Treasurer at \$100,000 each was approved by a vote of 6-0.


On motion by Creasy, seconded by Morgan, to set the bond for the President and Vice President of Council at \$25,000 each was approved by a vote of 6-0.
