REGULAR MEETING
JUNE 10, 2015

RECREATION REPORT

A motion to approve the pumpkin festival and the closing of Frack Street was made by Ms. Domalakes, seconded by Mr. Morgan. All in favor 5 -0. Motion carried.

Councilwomen Domalakes said there was twice as many people at the last pool meeting . The next meeting is scheduled for July 7, 2015.

A motion to approve the car show which will be through the pool committee was made by Ms. Domalakes, seconded by Mr. Morgan. All in favor 5 – 0. Motion carried.

Ms. Domalakes said cans will be put out for pool donations.

A motion to allow yoga classes in the gym as long as there is no conflict with the YMCA was made by Ms. Domalakes, seconded by Mr. Gotshall. All in favor 5 – 0. Motion carried.

A motion to accept the recreation report was made by Mr. Morgan, seconded by Mr. Creasy. All in favor 5 – 0. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the North Central Highway grant project for the contract and resolution was made by Mr. Creasy, seconded by Ms. Domalakes. Roll call vote went as follows: Morgan – abstain, Creasy – yes, Domalakes – yes, Gotshall – yes. And Jordan – yes. Motion carried.

Council gave the solicitor authority to communicate with the LCB in reference to the transferring of a liquor license.

A motion to give the public works director authorization to participate in a community service program was made by Mr. Morgan, seconded by Mr. Creasy. All in favor 5 – 0. Motion carried.

Councilman Morgan said the borough pays \$32,400.00 per year for the recycling program and we have only saved \$11,242.98.

A motion to stop the recycling program and put the money in a capital reserve account was made by Mr. Morgan, seconded by Mr. Creasy. Roll call vote went as follows: Creasy – yes, Domalakes – no, Gotshall – no, Morgan – yes, and Jordan – no. Motion failed.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Ron Leim – Center St., Frackville

Mr. Leim questioned the fire on Lehigh Avenue and the solicitor said it is still under investigation.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mr. Creasy, seconded by Mr. Morgan. All in favor 5 -0. Motion carried.



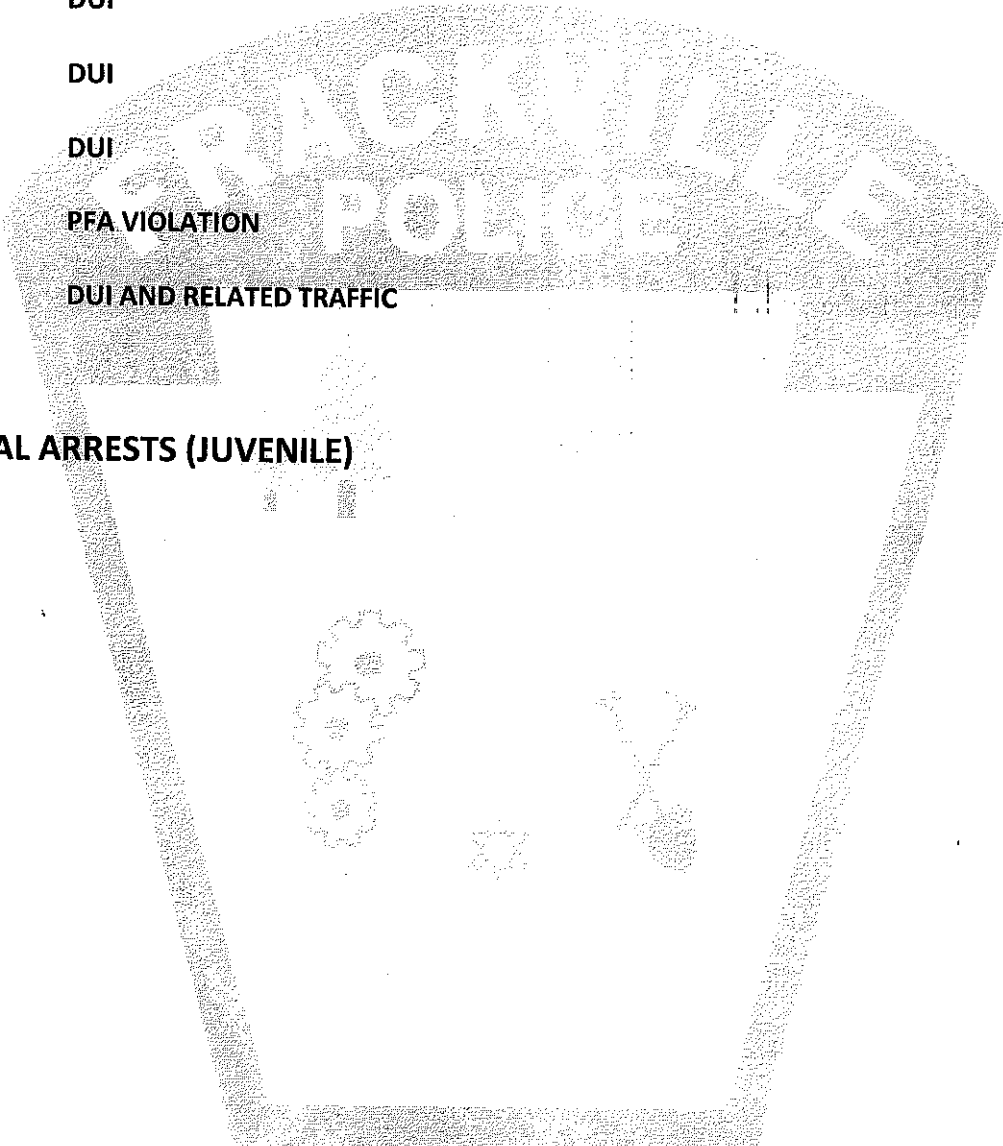


