

FRACKVILLE BOROUGH COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING
DECEMBER 9, 2016

The regular meeting of the Frackville Borough Council opened with the "Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag". President Jordan presided. Council members Berger, Creasy, Domalakes, Gotshall, Morgan, Zuber, along with Mayor Phillips, Secretary/Treasurer Deeter, Solicitor Semanchik, and a few citizens were in attendance.

The solicitor said the code enforcement hearings were at 5:15 p.m. today. Executive session was from 6 p.m. to 7:10 to discuss contracts, personnel, and property issues.

Patricia O'Connor attended the council meeting to discuss an affordable housing unit called the Cherry Street Commons. This is a 3 building housing unit which priority would be given to Frackville residents first. She said approval is needed for this project, along with a tax credit. Council will review the project along with the solicitor.

A motion that anyone hired full time and non union after January 1, 2014, will receive 20 days after your first year, then every two years will receive 2 days up to a total of 30 days, and can carryover their days up to a total of 30 days max. was made by Mr. Morgan, seconded by Mr. Creasy. Roll call vote went as follows: Creasy, Domalakes, Gotshall, Morgan, Zuber, Berger, and Jordan all voted yes. Motion carried.

My name is Rev. James Bowers, my wife Janet and I run God's Chuckwagon. We are a mobile soup kitchen. In October of 2011, we put a pot of soup in the back of our Chevy Malibu and served 25 people a bowl of soup, bread and a drink. We have continued to do this, with the help of donations we were able to purchase an old school bus, now serving 8 different communities in Northumberland and Schuylkill Counties. In 2014 we served 12,147 meals. At the end of 2015 we served 22,570 meals. We serve soup, sandwiches, desserts, drinks, and salads. We also hand out breads, and in the winter hats, scarfs, gloves and blankets. We also hand out care packages.

We also run a food pantry at our church in Helfenstein (Ashland).

Last year we had to move out of our home, and we were given a building to use as our base of operations, but have since outgrown this location. This past summer a building was donated to our organization, but is in major need of repairs.

We are a 501c3, non profit organization. Every donation goes right into the running of God's Chuckwagon. We are run by volunteers and no one takes a paycheck.

We run on donations only and have been Blessed to be able to do this . We are asking your permission to come into your town from 4-5, every Wednesday. This will not cost your town anything, except a place to park our bus. We would like to start March 2, 2016.
